Imagine Children's Museum Annual Report on Activities 2024



Imagine Children's Museum marked a series of important milestones in 2024. Each reflects meaningful growth and deepening impact in our community. With the museum's new expansion fully complete, our operations and activities showcase what it means to be an anchor institution for the city of Everett, Snohomish County, and the broader Puget Sound region. In June, Elizabeth (Elee) Wood was appointed Chief Executive Officer, succeeding long-time museum director Nancy Johnson. Wood brings a wealth of experience in the museum field and is poised to guide Imagine into its next chapter for a new generation of families.

We are honored to be recognized by the Everett Herald as the top family destination in Snohomish County. Being named the number one choice for family fun is a powerful reminder that our work through the careful design of experiences, thoughtful staff training, and a steadfast culture of welcome resonates with families across the region.

Notable Highlights for 2024

In February, artist Gina Ribaudo installed a mural on the external face of our property at Pacific and Colby, reflecting the Puget Sound life that echoes throughout our interior galleries. The mural serves as both a portrait of our local landscape and an invitation to visit and keep exploring.

Thanks to a major federal grant, our Little Science Lab expanded significantly this year. Over three years this funding will support deeper outreach, weekly science, and math sessions in libraries and community centers, bilingual learning opportunities, more Family Math Nights, and a dedicated staff member focused on early learning across Snohomish County. This growth moves us closer to our belief that curiosity should be accessible to every child, everywhere.

In August, Imagine welcomed our four millionth visitor, Aaron. We celebrated with a rooftop party and a million-bubble salute. This was an important moment to honor hundreds of thousands of families who have chosen this place as a home for play, learning, and discovery. We threw a party for Aaron that celebrated every visit, every laugh, and every small, brave experiment that happens here.

This year's milestones are just a few examples of the larger value that Imagine provides: a community choosing to invest in playful learning as a public good. We carry that trust forward, shaping experiences that invite wonder, build skills, and strengthen connections. Thank you for helping us make Imagine Children's Museum what it is today.
